CPPTD is dedicated to the restoration and preservation of buses from the city of Portsmouth and the south coast.

There are currently 20 vehicles looked after in our rented depots at Wicor Farm in Portchester, and at East Meon. The latter building is not suitable for members of the public to visit but we plan to hold open days at Wicor during the summer together with a modest programme of free bus services in Portsmouth and Southsea.

13 of our vehicles are owned by the Working Omnibus Museum Project (of which CPPTD is a constituent part), with others being owned by individuals, small groups and Portsmouth City Museums & Records Service. Some of the WOMP-owned vehicles are sponsored by their own dedicated support teams.

Our members include those who do the physical restoration work on the vehicles, drive and conduct, organise visits and tours or look after the grounds at Wicor Farm. If you are interested in old buses and have any sort of skill, CPPTD could be just your kind of society. Alternatively, if you do not wish, or are unable, to offer physical help, or live too far away, we will be just as pleased to welcome you, and your subscription will be equally as valuable.

For your annual subscription you will receive at least four issues of our magazine, the "BSBS", which will keep you informed of progress on the vehicles and depots, as well as news of other preservation projects in the area, articles and details of social events and visits to rallies and running days.

A proportion of your subscription will go towards preservation projects and the upkeep of the vehicles and depots, as well as the purchase of essential tools and equipment. You will also have the satisfaction of knowing that, by your practical, financial and moral support, items of importance in local road passenger transport history are being restored to working order and preserved for posterity.

DTP 823 1948 Leyland Titan PD1A with Weymann 56 seat bodywork, ex-City of Portsmouth no.189.

LRV 991 1956 Leyland Titan PD2/12 with Metro-Cammell-Weymann 59 seat open-top bodywork, ex-City of Portsmouth no.1.

LRV 996 1956 Leyland Titan PD2/12 with Metro-Cammell-Weymann 59 seat open-top bodywork, ex-City of Portsmouth no.4.

ORV 989 1958 Leyland Titan PD2/40 with Metro-Cammell-Weymann 56 seat bodywork, ex-City of Portsmouth no.112.

STP 995 1959 Leyland Titan PD3/6 with Metro-Cammell-Weymann 64 seat bodywork, ex-City of Portsmouth no.123.

ERV 251D 1966 Leyland Atlantean PDR1/1 with Metro-Cammell-Weymann 76 seat open top bodywork, ex-City of Portsmouth no.11

GTP 175F 1967 Leyland Panther Cub PSUR1/1 with Metro-Cammell-Weymann 42 seat bodywork, ex-City of Portsmouth no.175.

K916 VDV 1992 Iveco Daily 59.12 with Mellor B26D bodywork, ex-First in Hampshire & Dorset no.52016 but originally Blue Admiral no.248.

The following vehicles are also housed at Wicor Farm or East Meon and are looked after by CPPTD volunteers:-

RV 720 1931 Crossley Condor recovery vehicle, ex-City of Portsmouth no.74 (originally with Short Bros. 48 seat double-deck body). Owned by Portsmouth City Museums.

RV 3411 1933 Leyland Titan TD2 tower wagon, ex-City of Portsmouth no. TW1 (originally no.17 with English Electric 50 seat double-deck body). Owned by Portsmouth City Museums.

RV 4649 1934 A.E.C. 661T trolleybus with English Electric 50 seat bodywork, ex-City of

Portsmouth no.1, later 201. Owned by Portsmouth City Museums.

AHC 442 1951 A.E.C. Regent III with Bruce 56 seat bodywork, ex-Eastbourne Corporation no.42. Owned by the Eastbourne Regent Preservation Group, Cowplain.

EHV 65 1951 Bedford OB with Duple 29 seat bodywork, ex-East Ham Borough Council, London, but restored as Hants & Sussex no.31. Owned by the EHV 65 Group, Portsmouth.
